Miss Bee thus finds herself juggling secretarial duties and prestigious events, such as a reception in honour of a delegation from Florence, the Bernabòs' hometown. The Uffizi director and his archaeologist colleague are welcomed together with Edoardo, the Italian ambassador's son, and his fiancée, Elisa. Viscount Julian Lennox - towards whom Beatrice still has more overwhelming feelings than she would like - and his betrothed Lady Octavia are not missing either. But in the following days and especially nights, strange and frightening phenomena happen in the embassy: sudden noises, whispers in the dark and disturbing presences.

The only explanation seems the most implausible: a ghost. Things get worse, however, so much so that the police have to intervene in the person of Chief Inspector Archer Blackburn, an old and intriguing acquaintance of Beatrice.

But does the ghost of the embassy really exist? Or is some far more concrete and threatening force of nature at work?

Between love and trembling, it is up to Miss Bee to find out.

Ogni cosa aveva un colore

Un padre, un figlio e l'amore di chi resta

FEDERICO PACE (Rome, 1967), is a writer and journalist. He has written reports, stories, podcasts and narratives for numerous publications. He coordinates publishing initiatives to encourage writing among young people. He has published four collections of short stories for Einaudi: “Senza volo”, “Controvento”, “Scintille” and “La più bella estate”. For Laterza, the two books “La libertà viaggia in treno” and “Passaggi segreti”. His bestseller “Controvento” was defined by Vanja Luksic of the French weekly L'Express as ‘Intense and surprising’. With “Scintille” he won the International Literature Prize Città di Como and the Ceppo Selezione Racconto 2020 Prize.

His father had died a few months earlier, when Federico Pace was working on the work of the Swiss photographer Werner Bischof. While scrolling through the photos taken in Holland after the end of the Second World War, he found a series of portraits that were very different from the others. One of these is a punch in the stomach: the photo of a child who resembles his father, especially because of the scars that disfigure his face. This sudden realisation is where Pace's journey begins. He goes to the place where his father lived, visits the places he frequented, contacts his friends. He retraces his life. From the early years spent in a small village in the Agro Pontino to the special relationship with his uncle Manlio; from the explosion of the mine that deprived him of his sight at the age of five to the months of hospitalisation at the Policlinico Umberto I in Rome; from the years at the Istituto Romagnoli for the blind to the redemption of a man who has earned a future for himself by graduating, falling in love and getting married.

At the same time, driven by the force that only the entities he evokes possess, Pace sets out to find the child in the photo, who acquires a name, Jo Corbey, and a life to be discovered and understood. He too was a victim of the war's final twist in Roermond: the explosion of a mine. By interweaving the marks left by his father with those of Jo, almost a twin in terms of destiny and identity, Pace puts together the pieces of his father's story. In this way he restores tenderness and dignity to him, and finally finds a very personal way to say goodbye to him, to let him go, and to come to terms with his loss.

L'enigma della maschera

PAOLO LANZOTTI was born in Venice and graduated in Philosophy from the University of Padua.

An omnivorous reader with a preference for historical and scientific themes, he is also a lover of classical music and prose theatre.

A refined narrator, he was awarded with the Giallo Mondadori – Alberto Tedeschi Prize, previously awarded to renowned writers like Carlo Lucarelli and Giulio Leoni. "L'enigma della maschera" is his fourth novel in Marco Leon's series of investigations, after "L'alchimista della laguna" (2024), "Le ragioni dell'ombra" (2022) and "I guardiani della laguna" (2021) published by Tre60.

Venice 1754. Since leaving the Angeli Neri (Black Angels), the secret agent corps of the State Inquisition, Marco Leon has lived a seemingly quiet life as librarian to an elderly Venetian nobilhommo. The Angels miss him, but he has chosen to be with Marion, the woman he loves, and he does not regret his decision. However, his past is always lurking: surprisingly, Alvise Geminiani, the inquisitor in charge of the Angels, asks him to return to investigate, because a hitman, Fabio Groggia, has been killed, and the affair may involve a Venetian patrician, Enea Dorigo. In addition, some shady dealings would seem to lead to the Lazzaretto Vecchio, a very important Venetian garrison against epidemics. Before long, more murders happen and some clues lead Marco to Eugenio Flores, a patrician business partner of Enea Dorigo.

But what relationship could there be between the two patricians, the Lazzaretto, and the many murders that have occurred in recent times? And who is the mysterious Mask that roams the city asking uncomfortable questions? Before the very existence of the Republic is jeopardized by an epidemic, Mark has only to use his proverbial intuition to get to the bottom of the tangled affair, until the final confrontation with the murderer. A confrontation from which only one of the two will emerge alive.

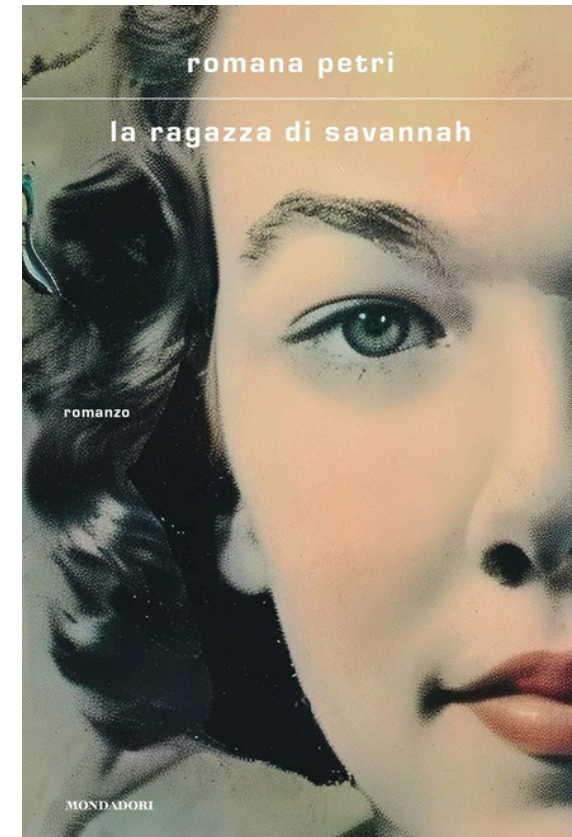
La ragazza di Savannah

ROMANA PETRI lives in Rome. That girl is Flannery O'Connor, one of the greatest authors of the 20th century. She enters the imagination of Romana Petri with her humble and her fools, her sinners, her loneliness, the splendor of her peacocks and the love she never had. Pitiful to the point of impiety, imbued with an irony that leaves her interlocutors astonished, Mary Flan finds her father suffering from the same disease, lupus, but she fights it with incandescent words and without ever complaining. She left her native Georgia when the call of literature became as strong as an investiture, a mission, but this dream of freedom was shattered by illness and she had to return to her mother's ranch, to that Regina who didn't understand her genius but who assisted her until the end.

She had a destiny as a well-bred Southern lady, but instead the girl from Savannah became a fearless writer (who could barely stand up on crutches), obsessed with the perfect phrase and with food as compensation for a denied love life, because no man was willing to love a cripple so close to Heaven. Romana Petri follows her around, spying on her, turning her inside out in front of us and we take her in like a drug that saves us, that prevents us from being afraid despite everything.

Eleven women dealing with common troubles, often trying to change the course of their lives, which seems to have already been established by someone else.

In “Eleven” we find unforgettable characters, such as Anna, a caregiver who finds a book of poems at an underground station, reads it and those poems will influence herself and even her attitude towards the elder man she looks after. Such as Aurora, who married a young member of the camorra in order to reach wellbeing and prosperity for herself and her children. And such as Luisella, the girl who wonders why a chair is kept in front of her parents' hosedoor.

The stories are told by eleven women, in a first-person narration. The language they use is vivid and fluent, the dialogues are perfectly shaped. The reader smiles and is moved at the same time.

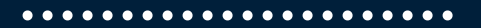
Moreover, Andrej Longo goes further. “Eleven, do not forget” is also a warning. It is a commandment, the eleventh actually, which forbids to forget what we would like not to remember.

It is forbidden to forget the injustice, the arrogance, the violence of which women are mostly the victims.

And it is also forbidden to forget how much beautiful life is when it is spent not just chasing our own pleasure.

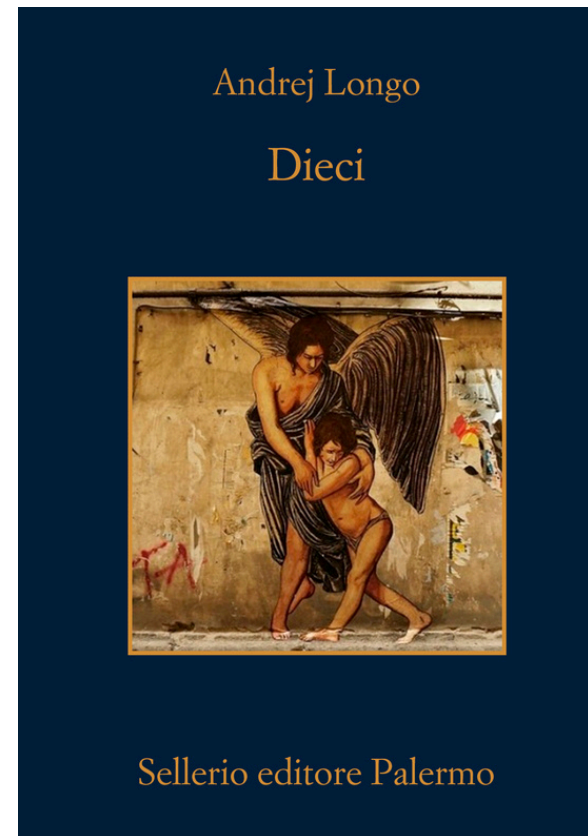

This means that the changings occurred in Naples have not come to its suburbs yet and ,furthermore, it means that Longo’s stories are universal. Because of this, they are out of time, they are definitely immune to time.

PAOLA DARÒ was born in Pinerolo in 1987 and lives in Turin.

She is a civil engineer: she works on structural monitoring of bridges and large infrastructures, immersed in sensors, numbers and algorithms.

“La finestra del terzo piano” (Piemme, 2025) is her debut novel.

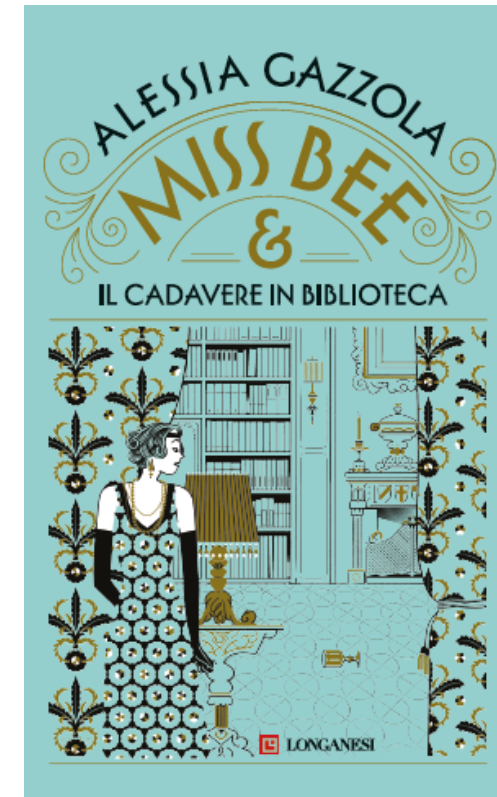

L'età sperimentale

ERRI DE LUCA was born in Naples in 1950. Before becoming a writer, he practiced various manual jobs in Africa, France, Italy. He studies Hebrew as a self-taught and translates some books of the Bible. He is a columnist for "il Manifesto."

No generation before the present one has reached old age with such a majority and in such an active state, which makes it an experimental age today. An opportunity, a chance to discover something new about oneself and others, to train one's body and mind more steadily. Not instead the time, as many think, to only look backwards. 'What does this age resemble?' asks De Luca. 'To the ascent of a mountain forest. In the thick of the conifers little light enters, I can just see what is tight around me, but upwards it thins out, clearings open up, there is more light. In this age from the top of the forest I see far away, glimpses of the future, not mine, the one without me. The dying poet Goethe utters the last two words: 'Mehr Licht', more light. It is not a request, it is the surprise of seeing it shine. Today I see a youth that feels its future as one with that of the entire earth. They look far ahead, they see the future. Even I, even the new old people, see further away, to the top of their woods.'

With some interventions by Ines de la Fressange, famous fashion designer and friend of the author, who looks at old age from her vantage point, "The experimental Age" is a book that is itself an opportunity to discover how resilient one can still be when one would not believe it, how many possibilities the third age contains.

MICHELA MATTEOLI directs the Neuroscience programme at Milan's Humanitas University Hospital, where she is also Professor of Pharmacology. She is a member of the prestigious Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei. Former director of the CNR Institute of Neuroscience, she is a member of the European Molecular Biology Organisation and the Academia Europaea, as well as of the ethical and scientific committees of the Umberto Veronesi Foundation. She is a member of international scientific assessment groups, including the European Research Council and the Swiss National Science Foundation.

In her career, she has received various awards; in 2013, she was awarded the Mid Career Mentoring Award by the prestigious journal Nature for inspiring a generation of young scientists.

She is the author of more than 170 publications with a high scientific impact and, in the field of popularisation, of the bestseller "Il talento del cervello" (Sonzogno, series "Scienze per la vita" conceived and directed by Eliana Liotta, 2022).

We all like to think that the brain does not have to deteriorate with age. This is why the increasingly flourishing strand of studies on neurogenesis in adults, i.e. the birth of nerve cells even when the organism's development is complete, is exciting. Michela Matteoli calls it, with a metaphor, the 'blossoming of the neurons' and imagines the brain as a garden that, properly watered, replaces with new shoots the withered seedlings, adds leaves to the branches of its trees, sees flowers bloom that were not there.

With her trademark clarity and affabulatory style, the great neuroscientist dismantles many misconceptions about how we are made and helps us understand, thanks to the latest discoveries and her own studies, how it is possible to cultivate our intelligence throughout life.

The book closes with a fascinating section devoted to the most topical issues, analysed through neuroscientific lenses. Should we fear artificial intelligence? Why does racism exist? What is the root of conflicts? What happens to the brain during a war?

The author's hope is that a springtime of the mind and species will come, in which each individual can aspire to full and complete human, intellectual, sentimental and ethical blossoming.

This year, the first bell of September has a sweeter ring for Anna Tosetti. It seems that, for once in her life, everything is going swimmingly. Or at least it is until it all goes wrong. She is not yet a tenured teacher. But after years of doing very short substitutions and always with practically no notice, she is now back in what she can consider to all intents and purposes her classroom. She will be able to see her students again. And this time she will be able to accompany them until the end of the year. Anna, however, has a terrible problem: she cannot mind her own business. She wants to help everyone, but she is also a magnet for trouble. And so, as she tries to bail out one of her students who has got into some shady business, she is confronted with terrible realities for which she is not at all prepared. When she is entrusted with a troubled boy, in order to help him, she complicates her life. When she notices that a colleague has been absent for too long, she decides to turn herself into a detective and has to face an avalanche of unforeseen events (including a cat that constantly ambushes her).

Thus, busy solving mysteries and remedying the disasters of others, Anna runs the risk of not realising that she is neglecting her own life. Yet it is from her students, those she thought she had to teach everything to, that she learns the most valuable lessons. And instead of letting her drown in a sea of troubles, the people she has helped will bring her to safety by making room for her in their lifeboat. Anna Tosetti is a difficult character to forget: a woman who perhaps meddles a little too much in other people's business, but who certainly does not leave anyone alone in the most difficult moments.

La straniera

MARTA AIDALA was born in Turin in 1996. At seventeen years old she fell in love with the mountains and her dream is to climb them to stay. After a variety of jobs, she attended the Holden School and graduated in 2023. Now she works in a bookshop and devotes herself to writing. “La straniera” is her debut novel.

Take her life and go - to understand herself, find a future, not to go down any more but to stay. These are the reasons for which, one morning in May, Beatrice leaves Turin to move to the mountains. Those mountains that, she is certain, are women even though they often bear male names. Women like her, who as soon as she arrives to the refuge of the Barba, a gruff man with a mysterious past, feels rejected, as woman and foreigner (“straniera”). Marta Aidala has the courage of a clear voice that lets gestures and events speak, the noises of the forest, the smells, the light of a sky high above the peaks. And she knows how to recount in the most concrete details a new epic, that of a girl who goes after her own freedom despite hesitations and fears, a girl who seeks herself on the trails and among the men of the mountains, in a world that she feels is hers even though the old traditions look at her with distrust. With fear and curiosity, as Elbio looks at her, the young herdsman with whom Beatrice will establish a profound bond, made up of reluctance and outbursts, in that fragile and poignant intimacy that arises between two people who mirror and recognise themselves.

When the summer ends, however, Beatrice decides not to follow Elbio to the valley, instead staying with the Barba in the refuge, a place that now, perhaps, she feels she can call home. But the snowless winter will reveal to her an unexpected mountain, pushing her to put everything into question, and questioning her once again about her future, the person she wants to be and the places where she feels she belongs.

Canti di guerra

STEFANO NAZZI is a journalist, he has worked for several important national newspapers. He has always covered news, following the best known and most resonant cases, but also lesser-known events.

Today he reports on news and current affairs for 'il Post'. He is the creator and author of "Indagini", at the top of the podcast charts, and author of "Il volto del male" (Mondadori, 2023).

"I liked the banks with the revolving door, one kick and the world would start turning. I'd go out first, take out a whole clip and start the Wild West. They called us 'The Wild Bunch'." This is the Milan of the 1970s. Dark, leaden, and unrecognisable compared to today's. Gun shells are trodden on the streets, the average number of murders is 150 a year, delinquents, businessmen and show business personalities mingle in nightclubs, and gambling dens are hidden inside unsuspected buildings. It is here that the destinies of the three bandits who will change the fortunes of Milan's criminal underworld intersect for the first time; their names are spoken in hushed voices because they carry a trail of gunpowder in their wake. They are three very different men: Francis Turatello, known as 'Faccia d'angelo', insatiable for power, Renato Vallanzasca, the 'handsome René', an anarchic robber who always likes to be the centre of attention, and Angelo Epaminonda, known as 'il Tebano', a ferocious and ruthless gangster.

Born without possessing anything, they are ready to take everything, first by shooting at each other, then by allying, then by shooting back. Around them, meanwhile, move the gang's affiliates, policemen and innocent victims. It is a black story of blood, betrayals and deaths, but also of partnerships, power and love. Stefano Nazzi reconstructs it with his intense and pressing prose, recounting the men behind the criminals and the shadows that made them such, because although more than thirty years have passed since the last gunshot, their echoes of war still resonate today.

Discorso per un amico

ERRI DE LUCA was born in Naples in 1950. Before becoming a writer, he practiced various manual jobs in Africa, France, Italy. He studies Hebrew as a self-taught and translates some books of the Bible. He is a columnist for "il Manifesto."

He has published with Feltrinelli (among others): "Non ora, non qui" (1989), "Una nuvola come tappeto" (1991), "In alto a sinistra" (1994), "Tu, mio" (1998), "Montedidio" (2001), "Il contrario di uno" (2003), "Mestieri all'aria aperta. Pastori e pescatori nell'Antico e nel Nuovo Testamento" (with Gennaro Matino, 2004), "In nome della madre" (2006), "Il giorno prima della felicità" (2009), "Il peso della farfalla" (2009), "I pesci non chiudono gli occhi" (2011), "La doppia vita dei numeri" (2012) and "Storia di Irene" (2013).

His most recent books published with Feltrinelli include "La faccia delle nuvole" (2016), "La natura esposta" (2016), "Il giro dell'oca" (2018), "Impossibile" (2019), "A grandezza naturale" (2021), the graphic novel "L'ora X. Una storia di Lotta Continua" (2019; with Cosimo Damiano Damato and Paolo Castaldi) and "Le regole dello Shangai" (2023).

"In faraway places we have shared nights with the crumbs of shooting stars, we have breathed in their dust ignited by friction with the air. In sleep we have felt the turning of the constellations with the North Star fixed at the center, in roulette pegs. We snatched certain nights like this from the life of days. Distant from candles, bulbs, lighthouses and watchtowers, we have fixed in our pupils the expanse of dots of light."

These are pages of restrained emotion, and for that reason all the more moving and vivid, these that Erri De Luca dedicates to his late friend, followed on climbs in the Himalayas, in Ecuador or in the Dolomites. In investigating the cause of his fall, in retracing the route where he died, searching for the precise point of his detachment from the rock, the author restores his body and voice, brings back pages from his notebooks and passages from the letters that over time they wrote to each other, drawing a concrete and poetic -

"he called gift a bunch of other things that didn't look like to me. The little dark cloud that in a clear weather precedes the storm, the flower in the crack of a cliff face, the encounter with an ibex: gifts. They are receive and that's it, maybe with a thank you." And at the same time he gives back, making us feel the rock under our fingers, the sound of the ibex's hooves as it flees, the weight of the body on the handholds, the shared love of the mountain, the reason itself of climbing (Diego writes: "this climbing on the border between life and death pleases me and makes me feel intensely the life. At the top I love everything and everyone") and to read. Friendship, mountains and books are intertwined in this Speech with gentleness, gratitude and sorrow, to go through grief and go beyond: "For me you remain Diego, for me you insist, carry on and I continue and follow you."

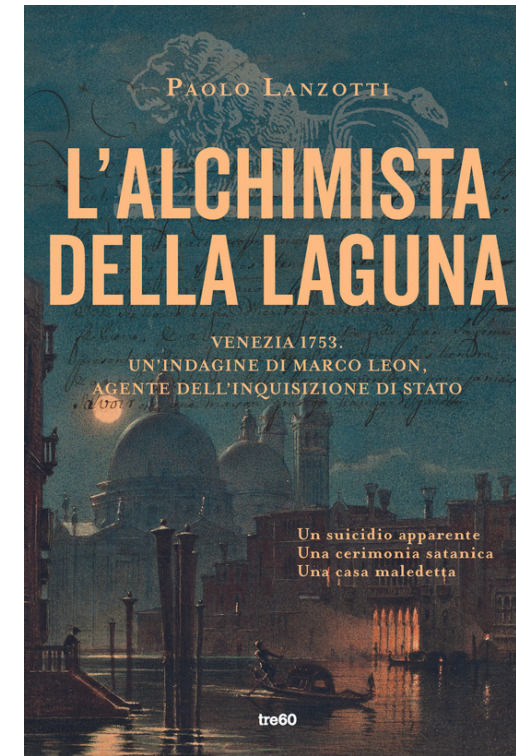
PAOLO LANZOTTI was born in Venice and graduated in Philosophy from the University of Padua.

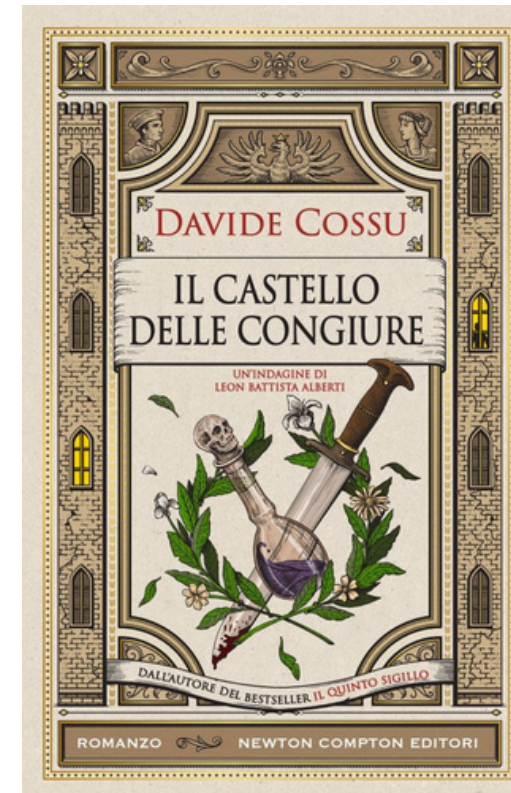

La forma dei sogni

ANDREJ LONGO, born in Ischia, is the author of works for theatre, radio and cinema. The Sellerio catalogue features "Solo la pioggia", "Mille giorni che non vieni" and some of his previous novels such as "Chi ha ucciso Sarah?", followed by "Dieci", winner of the Premio Bagutta and the Premio Chiara.

An anonymous phone call recommends keeping an eye on a certain Annamaria Di Spigno, a commoner living in Naples' Quartieri Spagnoli. The strange thing is that it was in all probability a woman from the city's affluent area who made the call, and this induces Commissioner Santagata to look into the matter. Meanwhile, the police officer Acanfora is grappling with his childhood friend Ciro, who has finally convinced himself to be housed in a rehabilitation community. On one condition, however: that Acanfora sends him a letter for every game played by Napoli. Acanfora, who understands little about football, agrees to help his friend, and thus begins to write him inimitable chronicles of the matches and the increasingly excited atmosphere in the city for the team's exploits. Santagata, meanwhile, discovers that Di Spigno is a notorious drug dealer, but when he and his trusted Acanfora set out to interrogate her, he learns that the woman has died. A suspicious death, especially since traditional mourning customs were not respected. Moreover, the woman was cremated in haste, almost as if to conceal inappropriate truths.

Santagata and Acanfora thus begin to investigate, threading their way through a labyrinth of hypotheses that seem indecipherable, but which seem to link the alleys of the Quartieri to the rich bourgeoisie.

To follow Santagata and Acanfora's investigations is to immerse oneself in the essence of a unique city. Firstly because of the adherent and extraordinarily expressive language used by the author. Secondly because every nook and cranny the two protagonists visit suddenly becomes alive and palpitating, dramatic and amusing at the same time. All wrapped up in the acute gaze of Acanfora, who tells the story in the first person, continuously enriching it with details worthy of a poet.

Grande meraviglia

VIOLA ARDONE was born in Naples in 1974. She has a degree in Literature and she used to work in the Publishing world. She teaches Latin and Italian at High School in Naples. For Einaudi Stile Libero she published "Il treno dei bambini" ("The Children's Train") in 2019, which proved to be the literary event of the year, it is presently being translated into thirty languages and will soon be the subject of a motion picture, and "Oliva Denaro", in 2021.

Among her novels there are also "Le ricette del cuore in subbuglio" (2013) and "Una rivoluzione sentimentale" (2016), both published by Salani.

Elba is named after a northern river: her mother chose it. They used to live together, in a place she calls the half-world and which is actually an asylum. Then her mother disappeared, and all that was left for her to do was to grow up, compiling her Diary of Mental Illnesses, and telling the newcomers to the ward about doctors Colavolpe and Lampadina, nurse Gillette, and Nana the cana. Of her universe, in short, the only one she knows. At least until a young psychiatrist, Fausto Meraviglia, figures in his head to get her out of the asylum, or rather to eliminate them altogether, asylums; after all, that is what the Basaglia law, passed a few years earlier, provides for. Dr. Meraviglia takes Elba to live in his house, like a daughter: the only one he has chosen, and thanks to whom he, who has never been a good father, learns the weight and strength of fatherhood. The love of others never depends on us alone. This is its mystery, but also its prodigy.

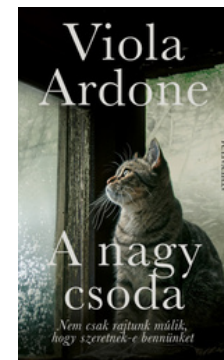

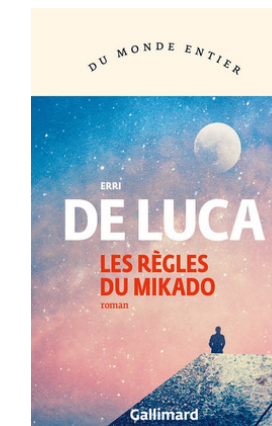

The arrival of thirty-six Jews from Naples, sent to the village by the fascist authorities, will change their lives forever. And so the illiterate son of a fascist learns to read and write thanks to a Jew.

Davide, Teresa, and Nicolas explore together the countryside around the village, as far as the Devil's Steeps (according to popular belief the footprints of the evil one are imprinted on the slope of the extinct volcano), but also the unexpressed world of their feelings.

The ghost of Nicolas will accompany Davide in the years to come, in Naples after the war. When he will work hard in the factory, when he will accidentally begin to attend a theater company, when – now a man, another man – he will tread the stage as an acclaimed actor. It will be Nicolas himself, alive and yet so much like a ghost, who will lead him back to Tora, to where it all began.

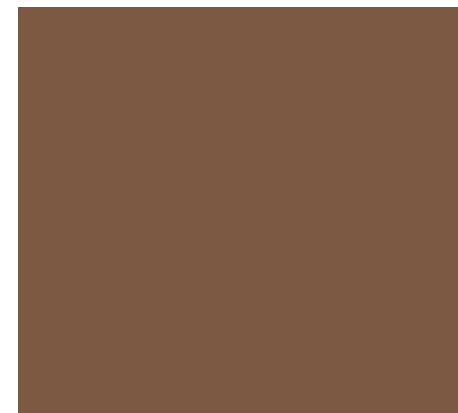
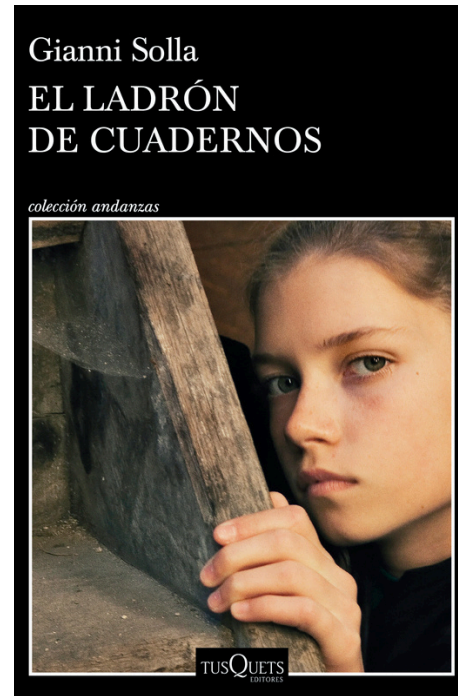

ELEONORA MAZZONI, after graduating in Literature at the University of Bologna with Professor Ezio Raimondi and a diploma in acting at the Theater School of Alessandra Galante Garrone, until 2010 she worked as an actress for theater, cinema and TV. She has published "Le difettose" (Einaudi, 2012), "Gli ipocriti" (Chiarelettere, 2015), "In becco alla cicogna!" (Biglia Blu, 2016) e "La testa sul tuo petto. Sulle tracce di San Giovanni" (San Paolo, 2016). Some of her short stories and writings have appeared in several anthologies. She writes subjects and scripts for cinema and television. The Manzoni, always called by the article preceding his last name, whom we imagine as students is a perpetually middle-aged man, with a grave and somewhat absent gaze, similar to the one portrayed by Francesco Hayez in one of his most famous paintings. A man who can hardly inspire sympathy, just as his masterpiece, *I promessi sposi* (The Betrothed), can hardly inspire it, which as listless adolescents we sip like a bitter medicine to swallow because "it's good for you." But, reading carefully the one thousand eight hundred letters he left us and the testimonies of family and friends, Manzoni turns out to be very different from that. An ironic and affable conversationalist, in the forefront of everything, animated by a burning political fire, when he was young he was rebellious and libertine, remaining restless throughout his existence. Indeed, once he became a writer, Alessandro, let's call him by his name now, poured his restlessness into his work as few others have been able to do. *I promessi sposi* (The Betrothed) reflects, in fact, all the passions that stirred an adventurous life full of emotional turmoil: maternal abandonment, fatherlessness, spiritual travail, the civil struggle for a united Italy free from the foreign oppressor.

A great popular novel, traversed by an indomitable spirit, capable of penetrating human beings and their hearts. And of still shaking our our soul.

BEATRICE SALVIONI was born in 1995 in Monza. She practiced medieval fencing and climbed Mt. Rose. In 2021, she graduated from the Holden School and won the Calvino Short Story Prize. This is her first novel.

Monza, March 1936: on the banks of the Lambro, two 12-year-old girls try to hide the corpse of a man who has pinned on his shirt a brooch with the fascio and the tricolor. They are shocked and half-dressed. It will be Francesca who will tell their story up to that point in first person.

Francesca is the typical respectable daughter of a middle-class family. Every day she spies from the bridge a girl playing together with boys in the river, she's barefoot with her skirt raised, her legs scratched and dirt of mud. Francesca dreams about becoming her friend, despite the fact that everyone in town considers Maddalena a curse-thrower, and scorns her by calling her Malnata. But that determined air of hers, the air of one who is not afraid of anything, fascinates Francesca. It will be the theft of cherries, her first lie, that will make them friends. Against the backdrop of the Abyssinian War, the pain of loss and the upheavals of adolescence, Francesca learns with her to denounce the overpowering and abuse of power, especially male power, despite the community's disapproval. Only the strength of an unbreakable friendship-the kind each of us has encountered at least once in our lives-can drive two teenage girls to rebel against injustice.

An outcast teenager, and a peer who learns to know her for real, beyond prejudice, and who, thanks to her, finds the courage to make her voice heard to confess the truth. An engaging coming-of-age novel set against the background of a Po Valley province oppressed by control, sexism and the violence of fascism. La bella confusione

FRANCESCO PICCOLO was born in Caserta in 1964; he is a writer and screenwriter. His latest books are *La separazione del maschio* (2008, Einaudi), *Momenti di trascurabile felicità* (2010, Einaudi), *Il desiderio di essere come tutti* (2013, Einaudi, Premio Strega prize-winner), *Momenti di trascurabile infelicità* (2015, Einaudi), *L'animale che mi porto dentro* (2018, Einaudi), *Momenti trascurabili vol. 3* (2020, Einaudi). Among others, he has signed screenplays for Paolo Virzì, Francesca Archibugi, Nanni Moretti, Marco Bellochio, Daniele Luchetti, Silvio Soldini, and also the TV series *L'amica geniale* and *La vita bugiarda degli adulti*. He collaborates with "la Repubblica."

Film history is not so different from life: seemingly linear, but studded with chance encounters, chased or missed appointments, last-minute decisions and unpredictable coincidences. Crucial fatalities that allow a work to come to light, with the precise characteristics that everyone will later remember. The choice of an actress, the light on the set, the sentimental vicissitudes of the director or a co-star, as well as budget cuts or a sudden scene change, can in their own way write a page of universal genius. 1963 is the year of Fellini and Visconti. This is what "La bella confusione" is: chasing like a detective the figures and episodes that made History, Francesco Piccolo sifted through letters, films, notes and diaries, interviews, gossip and testimonies.

For in this novel unlike any other, the characters are named Marcello Mastroianni, Ennio Flaiano, Sandra Milo, Tomasi di Lampedusa, Camilla Cederna, Suso Cecchi d'Amico, Burt Lancaster and Pier Paolo Pasolini. Moving between myth and anecdote, the unmistakable voice of the author of "Il desiderio di essere come tutti" awakens millions of memories and gives us the lost light of an era. A documentary made of words: the power of art, the secrets of cinema, the duels of an Italy we could no longer imagine.

Uvaspina

MONICA ACITO was born in 1993. She grew up in Cilento, between the Calore gorges and the temples of Paestum.

She started writing as a child, and since adolescence has collaborated with print and online publications. After graduating from classical high school she moved to the historic centre of Naples, between Forcella and Mezzocannone, and specialised in Modern Philology at the Federico II University. In 2019 she landed in Turin, where she attended the Scuola Holden. She was a member of the reading committee of the Calvino Prize and her short stories have been published in literary magazines and have won numerous prizes. She teaches humanities at middle and high school.

A birthmark under the left eye, as dark as a ripe grape embedded in the skin very clear: he was born that way, Uvaspina, so much so that he soon got used to being called by that name that identifies him with his spot. Uvaspina can get used to almost anything: to notary Pasquale Riccio, his father, who only comes home for meals and is ashamed of him; to the Spaiata, his mother, who after having set up Pasquale Riccio with her arts of *chiagnazzara* does not rest for having lost her own charm and pretends to die every time he leaves the house. But above all Uvaspina is used to his sister Minuccia, a little younger. Ever since she was a child, Minuccia is inhabited by an energy capable of unpredictable explosions, which precisely on Uvaspina measure their power: Minuccia holds her brother in check with her physical strength, with her cruel spites, with the acumen of one who knows how to strike at the point of maximum fragility, as when she tells him: "Your comrades were right, you really are a *femminiello*".

Yet only Uvaspina knows the deep trigger that makes her sister a strummolo, a spinning top capable of wounding with its swirling metal tip. And only Minuccia senses Uvaspina's dreams, when the strummolo keeps her awake and can peer at his fine features in his sleep

Around them, Naples: the city of seething bowels, of the neighborhoods reaching for the sky, from the long tentacles immersed in the sea that faces and penetrates it, right into the caves of Palazzo Donn'Anna. It is precisely on this border between the city and the sea, between history and myth, that Uvaspina meets Antonio, the fisherman with two different colours eyes who reads books and is not afraid of blood, who knows how to sail as far as Procida and get a crybaby who doubted himself his life back on track. The purity of their encounter, however, will not be hidden for long in the caves of Palazzo Donn'Anna: the city draws them to itself, the strummolo turns and its lace will unite their destinies forever.

His experiences in the field have been fundamental for the writing of the thriller "La condanna dei viventi", published by Longanesi. He lives between Pisa and Livorno with his wife Debora and their two children.

The child found in the night is hiding something. Fosco claims that he was kidnapped but managed to escape, running through the Tuscan countryside. Nobody believes him, or maybe no one has really tried to listen to him. I did. And I know that inside his story lies something terrible. Something bigger than him and perhaps even bigger than me. But what can it be? It is only when another child disappears that I begin to see a window of opportunity to carry out my investigation. Fosco and Andrea live far away from one another, they don't know each other, they have nothing in common. Except their appearance: they're identical, they could be twins. Andrea, however, does not reappear: it's up to me to find him, to find the person who killed his father and took him away from his mother. It's up to me to save his life. But I can't do it alone. The only one who believes in me is Fabio Costa, an outcast policeman with a dark past, exiled in a small provincial police station. While the number of victims increases and enigmas become more and more indecipherable, I understand that the author of these crimes responds to a superior plan. His obsession is morbid, cruel, unstoppable: to transform his visionary follies into violent realities, in delirious works of art.

My name is Valentina Medici, I am the youngest commissioner of the Service, and this is my first real investigation. And it may also be the last of my life. Because no one can fall into a pit so black, so deep, and hope to emerge from it unscathed.

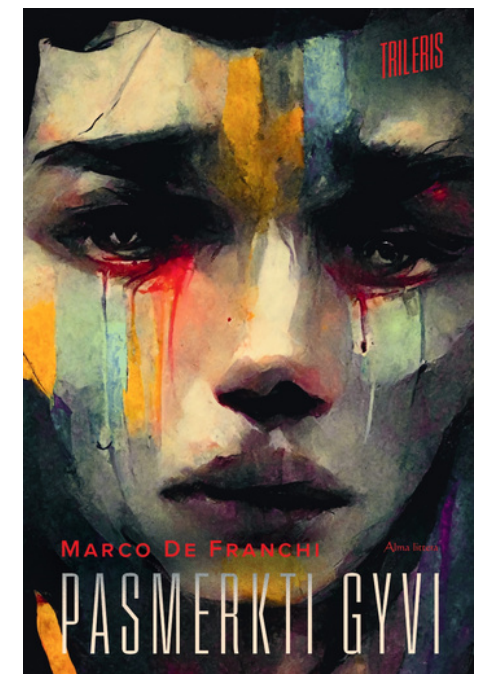
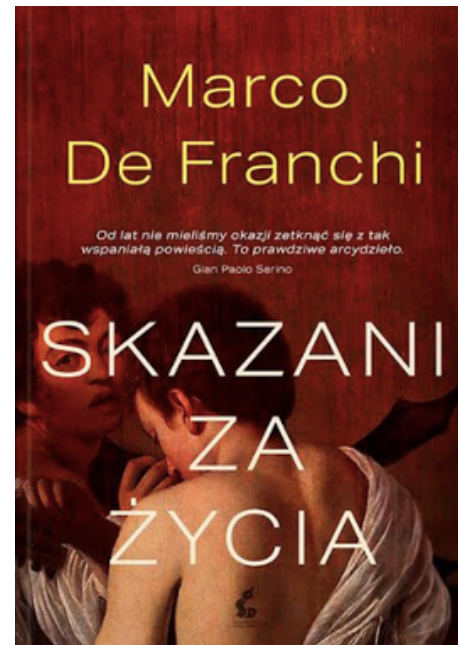

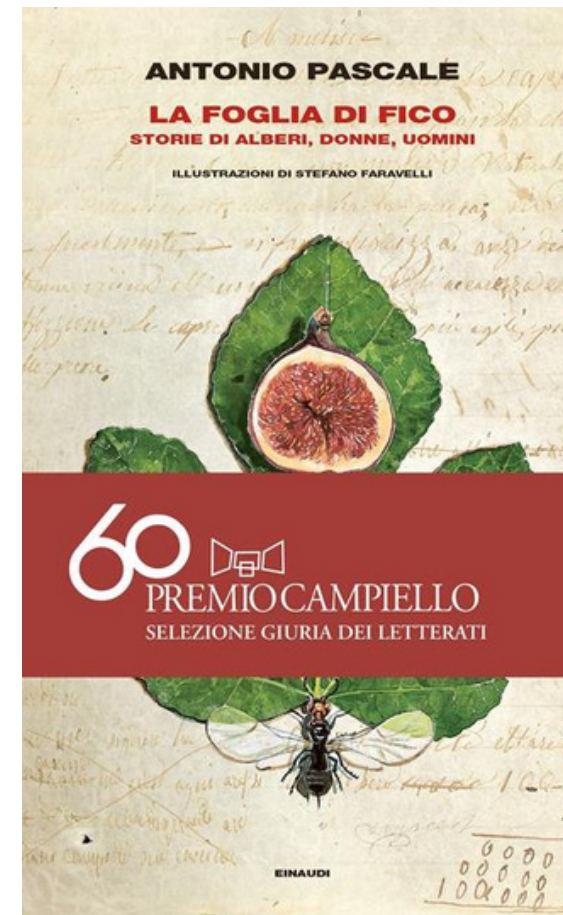
He contributes to the newspapers "Il Mattino", "Il Foglio" – for which he edits the twice-monthly insert on agriculture "Agrifoglio" – "Rivista Studio", "Link. Idee per la tv", "Mind", "Le Scienze", "limes", and he also writes a blog on "Post".

What is this book about? It's about a man who the more he lives, the more he forgets; the more he desires, the more he is disappointed; the more he reads and learns, the more he finds himself confused and afraid: a bit like everyone. That's why he is looking for something stable, some clear points of reference. Only he, unlike many others, turns to plants, constructing a sort of atypical tale, in which each episode is like a journey (through childhood, through time, through his relationships with women). After all, these magnificent creatures have been here long before us and will be here after we've gone.

Plants are beacons; they contain symbols that are thousands of years old, reaching us loud and clear. They defy adversity and thus offer us a model of resistance, for they tenaciously display the power of contradiction: the desire to live and love (expressed by the cherry tree) which can lead to frustration and insecurity; the strength (of the oak) which can abandon us instantly, casting us into despair; democracy as a process of adaptation between depth and surface (the olive); the need for a rite of passage (wheat), for a journey towards death in order to be reborn.

This book is a horoscope, a seismograph, a time machine, as well as a kind of botanical study of feelings. On the other hand, plants are an exceptional tool for dealing with our mysterious, amusing, intricate nature: they resemble us more than we might ever have thought.

In the world there are plant experts and there are writers: then there's Antonio Pascale, a passionate connoisseur of nature and one of the most widely appreciated storytellers of his generation. He knows how to interact with trees, listening to their stories and sensing their intrinsic beauty.

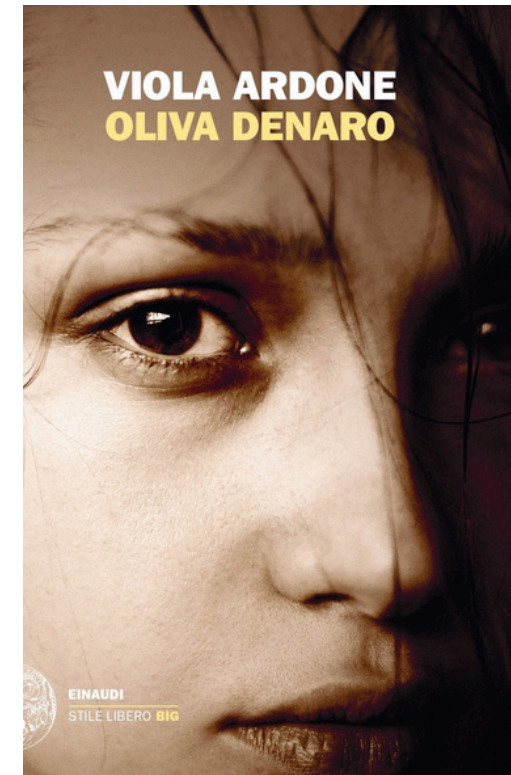
